History: In 1952, Congress passed a joint resolution, signed by President Truman,

establishing the Annual National Day of Prayer. The law was amended in 1988 and signed by President Ronald Reagan, permanently setting the day as the first Thursday of May. May 5th, 2022 will mark the 71th Annual

National Day of Prayer.

Theme: The 2022 theme "EXALT THE LORD WHO HAS ESTABLISHED

US" is based upon Colossians 2:6-7 "Therefore, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established

in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving."

Events: 11:30 AM – A County-wide Special Program at Rose Tree Park in Media

on Rt. 252 near Rt. 1, will be held in the park under the Big Flag adjacent to the

parking lot.
